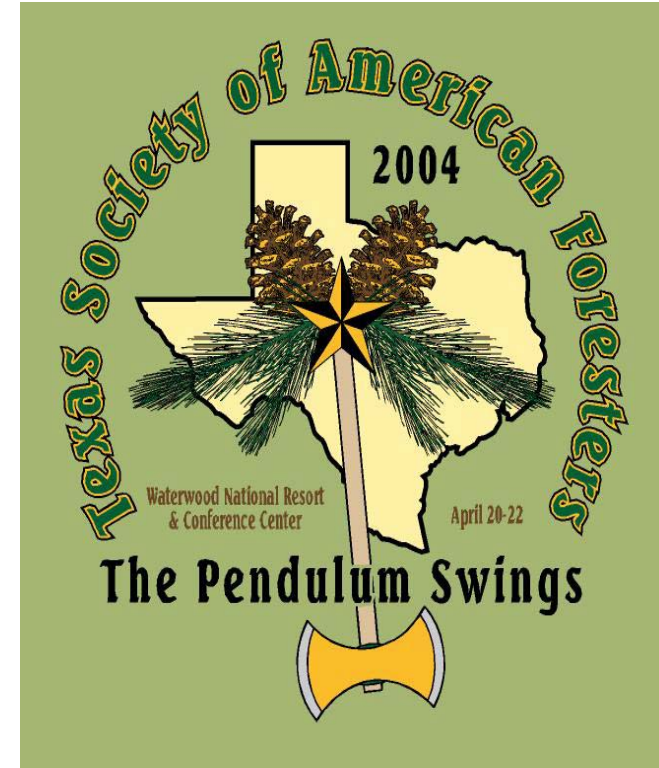

The Pendulum Swings

The major forces affecting forestry and foresters around the world have resulted in dynamic changes – changes in who we are, who owns our forestlands, the way we manage our forests, our management objectives and sources of revenue returns from operations, how we view the future, and who we consider our important partners. The theme for the Texas Society of American Foresters 2004 Annual Meeting, “The Pendulum Swings”, will address important issues facing foresters and the forestry sector in Texas in three sessions focused on “Changing Hands & Taking Stock”, “Seizing Opportunities” and the “National Outlook”.

Session I – Changing Hands & Taking Stock

The objective of this session will be directed to the professional needs of foresters, and will discuss how new and well-established owners and managers of forestlands in the Western Gulf region manage their forests for a variety of objectives during a period of changing approaches to stand management and silviculture. Speakers will address opportunities associated with allocation of land to a range of management intensities and management objectives at stand and landscape scales, including timber, bioenergy and new biobased products, carbon credits, water rights, wetland mitigation, game leases, recreation, and conservation easements.
